# **Home Learning Policy**

### **PURPOSE**

It is the policy of the school that some learning tasks or experiences will be set for students to complete at home

#### **GUIDELINES**

The school aims to:

- Promote the importance of literacy and numeracy at home
- Foster habits of independence and responsibility in students.
- Develop students' sense of achievement.
- Encourage positive attitudes towards the learning process.
- Foster a sense of curiosity about the world in which they live

The School believes:

- Reading at home to and with adults and other family members is an essential part of each child's learning development.
- Writing is a valuable experience that can be enhanced with real life writing opportunities.
- Using mathematics in everyday situations assists students to make sense of their everyday world.
- Home learning tasks or experiences should be diverse, be active and enhance family life, as well as be appropriate for the student and class.

#### **IMPLEMENTATION**

Parents are to be informed of intended Home Learning programs early in Term 1 of each year, through Parent Information sessions and documentation of grade procedures and expectations.

Responsibility of teachers includes:

- Setting of home learning tasks whilst providing clear and adequate instructions on the expectations of the task and the time frame for completion.
- Correcting and evaluating the completed work in an encouraging environment.
- Providing students with the opportunity to share their work and celebrate their achievements.
- Follow up with parents if a student regularly fails to complete homework.
- Teachers will monitor the completion of tasks and indications of parental involvement. Where there is cause for concern, a parent, student and teacher conference will be organised.

Responsibility of children includes:

- Taking the learning task home, completing it to the best of their ability and returning it to school in the agreed timeline.
- Engaging in home reading every night. This includes: reading a book, listening to stories, reading recipes, TV guides, newspapers, pamphlets and other signs and labels.
- Build links between maths ideas and how they are used in everyday life. This may includes: measuring activities, reading scales or automatic recall of number facts.

Responsibility of parents/guardians includes:

- Supervising and assisting children when needed.
- Making arrangements to provide adequate space and time for completion of learning activities.
- Encouraging children to manage time effectively, complete tasks on time and manage the balance between recreational and home learning activities.
- Communicating with the classroom teacher when concerns arise.
